Peggy Crim, Quincy city treasurer since 2001, is retiring.

"Being able to serve the people of Quincy the past 16 years has been an honor. I will always be grateful for the confidence voters have shown in me and the dedicated staff in the treasurer's office.

"However, it has become increasingly clear that growing family obligations requires more of my time than this job allows. I need to continue to put my family first, and to do that it is only fair to the city and the treasurer's office that I step aside."

Crim will remain treasurer for a "reasonable period of time" for a replacement to be confirmed by the city council.

Crim, 59, became the first woman to be elected city treasurer in 2001. She was re-elected four times and was unopposed in the April municipal election.

The city treasurer is primarily responsible for tracking, collecting and investing all city funds. The treasurer also serves in that same capacity on the city's fire and police pension boards. Crim has earned certifications as a municipal treasurer, as a public funds administrator and as a public funds investment manager.

Crim and her husband, Don, have three grown children and seven grandchildren.
